From the President May 2011

Our Easter Sunday competition went off very well ... we were so lucky with the weather ... we had a gorgeous day, albeit a cool start, a sunny and warm middle, and a coolish end ... but shortly after I got home and unpacked etc we had significant rainfall that night ... all I can say is that someone was looking out for us !!

The comp itself was great ... some great tests ridden in a relaxed atmosphere ... and it was one of our biggest comps for a while. We had one incident where a rider fell off and broke her wrist, but even that was handled smoothly, with an ambulance being called, the person going off to hospital, and then reappearing later in the day with her arm set and in a sling ... cheerful (maybe under the in-

fluence of drugs ??), but annoyed that riding was probably out for the next six weeks or so !!

This comp was the first at which we ran our new JACKPOT class ... the Prelim Associate 1C this time ... first, second and third placegetters won prize money ... a percentage of the entry fees the club received for that class. Later in this newsletter see who won and what they scored.

Also in this newsletter, the Point Score Leader Board !! Once again we will have some fabulous prizes for those members who perform consistently throughout the year and achieve the highest number of points for their horse and rider combination at a particular level. This year we have changed the point score rules to follow the change in the EA's method of calculating official points ... now what matters is the score you get, not how you place ... see details of the change described later in this newsletter.

Our next comp is on Sunday 26 June, shortly after the winter solstice ... the JACKPOT class this time is the Associate Novice 2C ... the entry fees received from entrants for this class will be pooled and the first, second and third placegetters for the class will receive prize money ... part incentive ..

and part recognition !!

The other big change is that ENTRIES HAVE GONE ONLINE. SCEC comps are now enterable through www.globalentriesonline.com.au ... you will be able to pay by credit card or by direct deposit into the SCEC bank account. Many of you will already have experience with this system as it is used by Berry Riding Club and Shoalhaven Dressage Club as well as many others. For those that have difficulty with the technology, please contact me and I will help you through it. Because it is an online system, and computers aren't as flexible as people, it will mean that the entry close date means exactly that, entries will CLOSE at the date and time nominated !! So don't be late ... get online and enter whilst you are thinking about it !!! The good news is that we will be able to extend the closing date to closer to the comp date because the system does a lot of the work that I would have had to tediously do by hand (in my spare moments !!).

Running competition days requires input from many people ... and we ask that all our members volunteer to help with one task or another as often as they possibly can, especially on competition days ... helping set up the grounds, penciling, collecting tests are

just some of the myriad of tasks that we need help with. Please don't be backward in coming forward and offering to help with whatever you can.

This year SCEC committee meetings will be held on the Wednesday a week and a half before each comp – that is, the committee will meet 6 times during the year (and probably an extra at the end of the year to sort out HOTY/point score etc), rather than each month. All members are welcome and we encourage anyone who may have ideas, suggestions or just a general interest in what's going on to come along. The next meeting is on Wednesday 15th June at 7.30pm at the Aviator Lounge, Albion Park Airport.

Finally, in my role as President, happy riding, and I look forward to talking, working and riding with many of you over the next year.

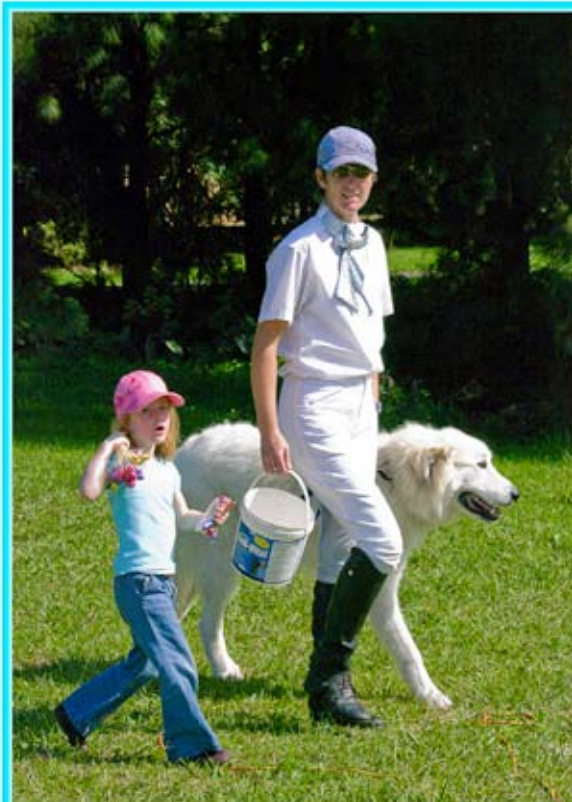

Our Competitions could not run without the generous help of volunteers.

If you or any one you know are able to give a little bit of your time to ensure we can continue to maintain the standard of our competitions.



- Horse and rider of the year prizes are awarded at the following levels - Preparatory, Preliminary, Novice, Elementary, Medium, Advanced and FEI
- Winners at each level are the horse (pony) and rider combinations with the highest cumulative points gained at that level.
- All divisions at each level are combined to establish the horse and rider of the year at that level – ie. Associate, Official, Pony, Official Pony and Junior.
- Perpetual Trophies are awarded to the divisions of Open, Pony and Junior on the basis of cumulative points (can be more than one level).

In line with the changes to the EA grading system, from 2011 points will be allocated on the basis of percentage achieved (not placing). Points are allocated on percentages achieved in every test.

Points are awarded as follows -

| • Between 58% - 59.999% | 1/2 point (SCEC Policy) |
| • Between 60% - 61.999% | 1 point |
| • Between 62% - 63.999% | 2 points |
| • Between 64% - 65.999% | 3 points |
| • Between 66% - 67.999% | 4 points |
| • Between 68% - 69.999% | 5 points |
| • Between 70% - 71.999% | 6 points |
| • Above 72% | 7 points |

To be eligible for point score awards -

1. Riders must be current members of SCEC when competing for points to be awarded.
2. The first 5 competitions of the year will be eligible for points.
3. Riders must compete in at least 3 of the eligible competitions during the year.
4. Points will be accrued on scores of 58% and above at each level.
5. If 3 tests are entered at any level during an event – the best 2 results will be used for the point score calculations.
6. Points are awarded to horse and rider combinations

Merit Awards

Merit awards can be achieved with consistent performance by horse and rider.

Bronze Merit Award for achieving 3 scores over 60%

Silver Merit Award for achieving 3 scores over 65%

Gold Merit Award for achieving 3 scores over 70%.

The Art of Rugging

To rug or not to rug that is the question.....

Why Rug?

Rugging your horse has a number of advantages

1. It helps to keep them clean
2. It stops them being annoyed by biting nasty insects
3. It prevents sunburn and sunbleaching in summer
4. It can maintain body condition in winter
5. It can prevent fungal skin conditions such as rain scald
6. Because we love them!

But rugging is time expensive and a commitment to a pattern of horse husbandry. Once a horse is rugged you can't just decide not to because its too cold and rainy to go out in the weather or leave heavy rugs on because you have a hangover or are staying at a friends place.

Rules of Rugging

1. Ensure rugs are a good fit (see footnote on fitting)
2. Ensure rugs fit the purpose intended
3. Ensure rugs are reasonably clean and free from build up of hair, mud and creepy crawlies.
4. Make sure the horse is not too hot! Over rugging can cause coat bleaching, skin problems and dehydration because the horse gets too hot, sweaty and can't generally get the rug off themselves.

A guide that I use...In winter is that they are just slightly warmer than the temperature I am and that their coat is dry, if I want to snuggle up under the rug with them then it's a good temperature.

...in summer ...that they are cooler than the am-

bient temperature, the white or mesh rugs should reflect heat making the horse cooler, some days though it is just too hot, usually over 35c when I will leave them naked as it is just too hot!

5. A horse will be much more comfy in a cotton and one warm rug or combo than half a dozen rugs with multiple leg straps between their legs, its easier for you to change them too.

6. Rugging will not make the coat go short in winter, this is all due to sunlight hours but if you start to rug heavier when the nights get cooler then the coat will generally stay shorter, working horses in winter will also keep the coat shorter due to increased metabolism.

7. If you clip your horse it will need to be rugged to replace the hair you shaved off, as a rough guide, one blanket worth extra to what you would use if not clipped. Clipped horses skin can be prone to rubbing so a clean cotton rug and or satin shoulder bib is advisable, also using a coat sheen once a week as part of your normal grooming will help stop shoulder rub and prevent static.



8. Allow sunlight on your horse's coat, if it's a nice day let them have a few hours in their birthday suit, even in winter, they need the vitamin D, so you have to brush the dirt and mud off after, think of it as exercise. J

9. If you don't fully unrug, ensure that the mane is combed out everyday as hoods and combos have a tendency to rub out the mane because of the weight and a build up of dirt, sweat, grime and dead skin cells on the inside of the fabric. I give the mane a squirt of no-knots to keep it slippery and nourished.

10. On wet summer days it is best to leave the horse un rugged as having a wet rug on can make the horse cold as the weight of the wet fabric flattens the coat against the skin. A horse naturally fluffs the coat up to create an air pocket to keep the water and cold away from the skin.

Some tips for the care of your Rug or Combo that will ensure years of warmth and protection of your horses and ponies. of making your leg appear longer! Let dry and polish as before.



1. Always redo up legstraps before removing rug from horse to avoid hitting horse or yourself with clips and to ensure straps do not get trod on or caught on fences etc that you may hang it over.

2. Ensure all legstraps and surcingles are tighten sufficiently to ensure optimum fit and comfort and to avoid risk of horse catching their legs on them when rolling or lying down.

3. Allow rug to dry fully before putting away.

4. Do not let mud dry in clips or buckles if possible. Rinse out and apply a little WD40 spray.

5. If your horse has enjoyed a good wallow in the mud, you can let the mud dry and then brush off with a stiff brush.

6. It is recommended to hang rug when not

being used in a sheltered place away from direct sunlight and strong winds, as these can deteriorate the fabric and damage the rug.

7. We recommend the use of cotton under rugs as these are easier to clean and healthy for your horses coat and skin.

8. When cleaning the waterproof rugs and combos, use a mild soap and soft brush for home cleaning. Do not use bleach. Harsh detergents will remove the waterproofing. This can be re-coated.

9. We recommend before storage of rugs or combos when not being used the professional cleaning services of Clippity Clop Cleaners www.clippity-clop.com who also do repairs and re-proofing.

To measure your horse or pony for a rug if unsure of size, measure from the middle of the chest where the buckle would sit, around the shoulder and straight back to the roundest part of the rump. This can be done with a sewing tape measure. Please note that rugs are measured in feet and inches.

Happy rugging and I hope to see shiny healthy horses in their fabulous winter woolies.
